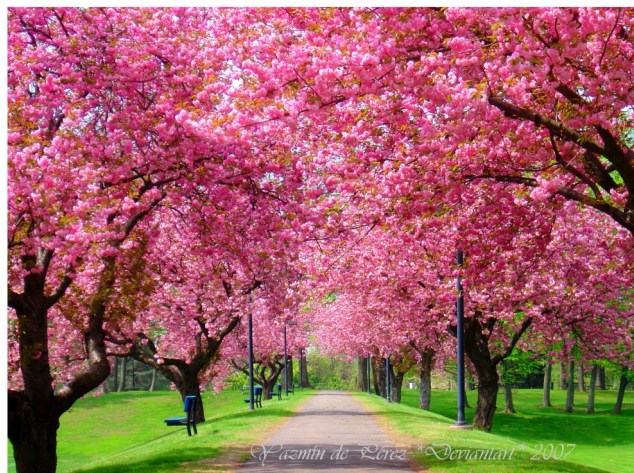

Blankets of Hope

You can purchase Blankets of Hope on May 14th and May 21. These blankets are used to give to people who are involved in disasters of any kind. Church World Service will take our gifts and give them to people in need. You can purchase them in honor or memory of anyone who has held you in a blanket or anyone you have held in a blanket. Unfortunately, inflation has caught up with us. The blankets are now \$10.

On-line Giving Capabilities

Valley has engaged the services of EasyTithe to offer interested persons the option of secure on-line giving via the church website (www.vccbhm.org). Many churches now offer this capability on their websites, which allows church members and friends to contribute their tithes and offerings conveniently from anywhere at anytime, either once or on an automatic recurring basis. As always, Valley gladly will continue to accept checks and cash through the mail, dropped off at the church office, or placed in the offering plate during Sunday morning worship. To give, choose the "Giving" tab on the home page of the website and you will be directed to another page to sign up. You may designate which fund you wish your contribution to help (General Fund, Special Day offerings, Memorial Gifts, etc.), and you may give via credit or debit card, Google Pay, or ACH (from your checking account). The processing fee is 0.75% for ACH donations and 1.99% for credit or debit cards and Google Pay; contributors have the option to cover this fee if they wish to. For example, the processing fee for a \$50 gift via ACH is only 38 cents. Additionally, Valley pays 77 cents for each contribution transaction. Contributions are directly deposited into the church's bank account and the financial secretary receives notification by email. The donor also receives an email receipt. If you are interested, please explore the page on the website. I am available for any questions or to provide assistance with using the feature.
