#### A WORD FROM YOUR PASTOR

A great deal of life is like driving in the fog. Our visibility is limited and we move slowly along the roads of life. We do not have a clear vision of what will happen next. Trying to find our way through personal problems, the Coronavirus, economic concerns, protests in our cities and family issues is like driving through the fog rather than moving down the road on a clear day.

Likewise, matters of faith are sometimes more like a

fog than a clear day. Most of us live in a fog when it comes to questions like, "Why God, is the Coronavirus happening?" And, "What does God want me to do during these challenging days?" We are not really sure of how to live our lives for God. Where is the answer for these moments of limited vision? As he got to the man's house, he noticed on the porch a woman sitting in a wheelchair. After some conversation, the pastor asked the man, "Sir, I hear you whistling all the time when I pass by. Tell me, why do you whistle so much?" The man said, "Well, you see, my wife is crippled and also blind. She cannot see where I go and what I am doing. I whistle to let her know that I am nearby. I whistle to let her know that if she ever needs me I will be there."

We need to remember in those moments of fog and spiritual blindness in our lives, God is whistling and trying to let us know that He is near. That He loves us. The He will answer some of our questions in His time. That He wants to use His power to perform some fog clearing moment in our lives.
