## **COFFEE AND A STORY**

Church, you do not need me to tell you how uncommon the first two weeks of 2021 have already been, so I won't.

You do not need me to tell you that we follow, worship, and claim as the one true Son of God a Messiah who preached against senseless violence, so I won't.

What I will tell you is that what 2021 has already thrown at us is a test, though not necessarily one sent by God. It is a test of our own making, a test constructed over the course of many months and years, to see just how committed we are to the ideals of big-t Truth, justice, equality, and democracy.

Not all trials are God-made, or God-ordained. We by our own choices are very capable of creating trials for ourselves, and we by our own choices hold the keys to passing such trials. In this case, I firmly believe that our successful passage through this trial relies upon our commitment to one another's human rights, including and especially the right to vote, and our commitment to uprooting and taking apart prejudices in ourselves and in those around us—including and especially racism.

We can, and must, rely on God for the strength to keep this commitment. Prejudices such as racism do not exist because God made them so, they exist because we made them so. God is infinitely more enduring than our own human creations, and so we should look to God as our first example of being bigger and better than the bigotries we as humans have built and subscribed to over the centuries. If we rely on God to give us the strength to do what is right, and just, and equitable, we can have faith in God to so strengthen us for that great, soul-sized task.

Finally, as covid-19 vaccinations become more widely available, I strongly encourage everyone to ask your doctors about getting vaccinated. Not only do the vaccines represent our best possible chance by far of finally bringing this pandemic to an end, but they also represent our fastest path towards at long last safely resuming in-person Sunday worship together. In the meanwhile, please continue to wear masks and stay safe—I have likened this in conversations with y'all with being towards the end of a marathon and being utterly exhausted, but still needing to finish the race. We have achieved so much in keeping one another safe these past ten months, but we still need to make it to the finish line of this together.
