Coffee and a Story

When you read this, I will be on a week of vacation to move my family into our new house in Hoover after renting in Cahaba Heights for our first year here with all of you. This is a big step for us in putting down roots in the Birmingham area, and Carrie, Sadie, and I are excited to call it home.

We have lots on tap after I return at the start of August. I hope you and any four-legged companions you may care for can make it to our Blessing of the Pets service the morning of Saturday, August 7! The event will open at 10:00 with both human- and pet-friendly refreshments, followed by a dog obedience tutorial presented by pet trainer Vicki Shay (sorry, cat owners—we just assume by this point that cats aren't interested in obedience:)). We have a great deal of historical material in the church archives on the construction of our Gothic revival sanctuary, and I hope to put much of it on display to enjoy as part of the anniversary.
