Coffee and a Story

I am looking forward to returning to the pulpit after two Sundays away, and I trust that you had a positive experience of my friend and colleague Ryan Cagle bringing the Word from Mark's Gospel on those two Sundays. We immediately jump right back into the thick of things on Sunday, October 24, with Pledge Sunday. Pledge Sunday is the culmination of our annual month-long steward-ship campaign in which we prayerfully invite each of you to bring your pledge cards to worship and present them to the deacons as they receive the morning offering. These pledge cards are vital tools for our stewardship department in planning and writing the 2022 budget, and we appreciate not only your generosity but your willingness to participate in the pledging of your gifts so that we may plan accordingly for the coming year.

October 24 is more than Pledge Sunday—it will also kick off a new five-week sermon series that will take us up to the start of Advent at the end of November. The covid-19 pandemic's direct and indirect impacts on us as a society and a country remain ongoing, and truthfully it will be some time after the dust settles before we will really know for sure the extent of those impacts. But an immediately clear one to me has been the increasingly urgent need for peacemaking as a discipline.

I try to differentiate between peacemaking and peacekeeping on the basis that keeping the peace suggests that there is already a peace in place to maintain, which has perhaps been missing for many of us during covid. From upheaval with our jobs to increased partisanship and violent divisiveness in our politics, I am witnessing an absence of true, deep peace, which means that rather than peacekeeping, we need peacemaking: the making of peace.

What does that look like? Well, the Bible gives us some clues, and we will cover some of what Jesus, Stephen, Paul, and James the brother of Jesus had to say about the nature of making peace in extraordinary times. I hope you find this series useful, and I look forward to sharing it with you:
