## **Coffee and a Story**

As October turned into November, we were all served up a belated reminder of the change of seasons as the daily temperatures plunged almost overnight from the mid-70s to the 50s. First and foremost, I would ask you to keep on your hearts and in your minds those among us for whom such rapid changes in temperature can be difficult or even dangerous to adjust to, including people experiencing homelessness. We are keeping with our commitment to the more vulnerable among us this week with our "Yes, I Can" food pantry drive on behalf of Greater Birmingham Ministries, and it is still not too late to participate! Meanwhile, I wanted to also share two other opportunities for education and fellowship in the near future that I hope you will enjoy: first, our November Sunday School monthly topic is on forgiveness—a topic I have very much looked forward to teaching on ever since Lola Kiser and I arrived at our autumn list of class topics back in July and August. At 9:30 am each Sunday in November, we will be looking at what both Paul and Jesus have to say about forgiveness before asking what other faith traditions say about forgiveness and what we, ourselves, personally ultimately believe about forgiveness. If you have been worshiping with us online and would like to participate in Sunday School as well, please reach out to me so that we can arrange that!

Second, I am happy to share that beginning Wednesday, December 1, we will be bringing back an Advent Valley tradition: the weekday lunchtime "Sounds of Advent" carol-sing. On three Wednesdays in December, the 1<sup>st</sup>, the 15<sup>th</sup>, and the 22<sup>nd</sup>, you are invited to join us at the church at 11:30 am for a hymn-sing of Advent hymns (on the 1<sup>st</sup>) and Christmas hymns (on the 15<sup>th</sup> and 22<sup>nd</sup>) and a brief Advent Bible study before adjourning for an optional lunch off-site. John Neville will help us kick festivities off on the 1<sup>st</sup> with his piano playing. We will observe our usual covid-19 protocols of universal masking, social distancing, and the availability of hand sanitizer at each Wednesday event. My thanks to John Gregory and Cindy Neville from the worship department in brainstorming this revival of a Valley Advent tradition to help it fit for our current circumstances.

I hope to see you at either or both of these upcoming offerings, and stay warm as autumn continues to get closer and closer to winter!
