Coffee and a Story

As several of you know by now, this past Sunday, the day we gather to worship during Sabbath, my maternal grandfather died at the age of eighty-nine. He had been in ill health for quite some time, so his death was not unexpected, but his decline at the end was very sudden, and I had not anticipated it.

By the time you read this, I am likely to be in Kansas City with my family, or en route to Kansas—we are planning a Friday funeral for my grandfather, and I am traveling back to Birmingham on Saturday so that I can be back in worship this upcoming Sunday to wrap up our five-week sermon series on peacemaking. While I am away with my family, I know that you will be in the caring hands of your respective shepherd-group elders.

We are also almost at both the Thanksgiving holiday and, that following Sunday, the beginning of a new church year with the start of Advent. Carrie, Sadie, and I will be celebrating Thanksgiving with Carrie's family in western North Carolina, and we will leave Wednesday afternoon and I will return on Saturday so that we can begin the Advent season together on Sunday!

I am very excited to finally share with you my Advent sermon series, which like my Lenten series earlier this year, is twinned with the "Gifts Given and Received" theme of our seasonal devotional book, which should be available to all of you very soon. I think our ability to express ourselves spiritually in the written word like this is one area in which we as a smaller congregation punch above our proverbial weight, and I have been looking forward for weeks now to reading each day's devotion during Advent. I am grateful to each of our devotional writers, and to Lola Kiser for arriving at the theme and editing our contributions.

In the meantime, I hope to see you on Sunday, online or in-person, as we add to our devotional theme this year with an Advent sermon series on the theme of gift -giving as part of our spiritual preparation for Christ's wondrous birth:

The First White House of the Confederacy

AAA will visit this Historic Home in Montgomery on Wednesday, December 8th. We will leave the church at 9:15am for an 11:00am - 12:00pm tour of the home decorated with Christmas decorations of the time. We will see what homes looked like pre-colored blinking lights and nodding reindeer on front lawns. We will take a step back in time to December 20th 1860 and the turmoil of the State of Alabama, along with other Southern States, as they seceded from the United States. Montgomery was chosen as the capital because of the location over looking the Alabama River and the Federal Road that led from Georgia to Mobile, both good for transportation facilities by railroad and steamboat. Jefferson Davis, the first President of the Confederacy with his wife Varina and her children set up housekeeping and lived in the house during the Summer of 1861 before moving to the new capital in Richmond, Virginia after living in the house only a few months.

We will then enjoy lunch at the Farmer's Market restaurant at 12:30pm before caravanning back to the church.
