For so many, their cell phone is their life as it holds pictures, allows streaming of movies, handles our banking, can lock and unlock doors, even start cars. It can be our weather forecaster, our gaming center, news reporter and of course our link to our social media accounts. It can help us when we are lost or need directions, it can give us lists of restaurants, gas stations, grocery stores and churches that are near us and it can track our every movement. It can text, email, snapchat and facetime with just about anyone anywhere in the world in an instant. It is as close to an all -in-one device that we can imagine and let's not forget it can make a call if needed. What would we do if we didn't have the use of our cell phone. I think many would go into withdrawal not really knowing what to do or where to turn. The cell phone has become part of our lives as much as eating, sleeping and living. # Update on Valley Christian Church Planning

At our planning meeting in January, I laid out a plan to discern God's will for us moving forward. Valley Christian Church (Disciples of Christ) has a long legacy of service, outreach and support for the community, and I wanted to leverage that while at the same time refocusing ourselves to what we believe God is calling us to be and do in our current state.

The plan was three-fold, first to discern God's vision for us and from that formulate our mission. That would lead us into ministries that fed both the vision and mission and would help us focus on that which we believe God was calling us to be at this time. Accepting the fact that we are smallish, that we have some years on us and that although we may want to do as many things as we can, we need to be good stewards of all of our resources including how thin we spread ourselves.

I believe that by going through this process we will land on a ministry or ministries that will not only maximize our resources but do so in a way that leaves room for growth and not leave us burned out or feeling overburdened. It will also help us focus our resources on that which we believe God is calling us to do at this particular moment.

It seems like a long-winded way to get to actual ministry, but I believe that in the journey we will not only learn what God wants us to do, but also more about ourselves and what fuels us as Disciples of Christ.

The first step then was to discern God's vision for us, and this was done through intentional prayer, a survey and conversations with this body of Christ. At our gathering on September 15, we put forth what we believe is God's vision for us; Valley Christian Church (Disciples of Christ) is a Bible-based, spirit-filled family where the love of God meets the world through outreach and a growing commitment to be the hands and feet of Jesus Christ.

This first part now will inform everything that follows as everything we say and do needs to feed into this vision. Our next step is to discern our mission which is the "how" part of the equation. How will we make this vision a reality? This is different than the "what" which will be the actual ministries. How will we show the love of Christ, how will we be the hands and feet of Christ? One way we show the love of Christ is through our worship. Others include our Bible study, our disciples' groups, our fellowship as well as our outreach activities.

To get the ball rolling, I thought of this: At Valley Christian Church (Disciples of Christ) our mission is to share the love of God through meaningful worship, engaged fellowship groups and inspired service to our community.

This is just to get started and while it sounds quite close to our vision, there is a difference. The vision is what we hope to be, the hands and feet of Christ where the love of God meets the people. The mission is the how; through worship, through fellowship, through outreach, etc.

The last part then will be to put the "what" into this process. What will we do to bring the love, to be the hands and feet. This is the nuts and bolts, the actual ministries that we engage in to fulfill the mission and feed into the vision.

I firmly believe that if we finish this process, we will have a clear idea of who we are, how we are to move forward and what it is we are being called to do now and into the future. And this will not only help us focus but be a foundation upon which we can grow both internally as well as externally. With God's help, we will get there.
