AAA Trip for January

The Seniors and Friends of Valley are invited to our January trip to Wheeler Wildlife Refuge in Decatur, Alabama on Wednesday, January 31, 2023, leaving the church at 9:00am with arrival at 11:30am. Wheeler Wildlife Refuge is named after Major General (Fightin' Joe) Joe Wheeler. He was a graduate of West Point and served in the Confederate Army, the Spanish American Army and the U.S. Congress from Alabama.

He is also one of the few Confederate Army Officers buried at Arlington Cemetery. Wheeler Wildlife Refuge is a 35,000 acre refuge managed and protected by the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service. It is the habitat for wintering and migrating birds, cranes, ducks, geese, the endangered Whooping Crane and twelve other federally endangered species. There is not admission charge or a guide at this facility, but we will see a movie showing what we will be able to view from their newly renovated Observation Building that is set in a blind in order to view the waterfowl in their natural habitat. This will be a very interesting trip. Let Marilyn or Peggi know if you want to ride the van or if you plan on driving. As always, first come first served on the van. There is an \$8.00 gas fee.
