If you want to know what time it is, you look at a clock. If you want to know how cold it is, you look at the thermometer. If you want to know how fast you are going, you check the speedometer. And if you want to know how far off course you are, you check your compass. As we enter a new year we need to check our spiritual compass. A compass to help us be on the right course. God has given us His word as a spiritual compass. A compass that helps us to tell right from wrong. Let me offer some suggestions about His spiritual compass.

First, when we are confused by a question of right and wrong, then let us search the scriptures. To let them be our spiritual compass and to see what God would have us do. The Bible is God's word. "It is a lamp to our feet and a light to our pathway." It is the right place to start.

Second, when we are confused over a moral issue, may we just try to use some common sense. God gave us minds to use. Think about it. Does this seem right? Does this sound right? Does it make sense to do this?

A third guideline for our following a spiritual compass is to address the question of right or wrong to the test of our best self. We are not always at our best. We do not always see the whole picture and we often say things that we are sorry about later. We may take a position that does not actually reflect our highest and best. Let us stop and allow our best self to look at a situation. Then we will come closer to doing the right thing.

A final guideline in following a spiritual compass and God's way is to look toward the future. Look ahead and on down the road. Where does the road lead? Jesus gives a spiritual compass for looking ahead in the Sermon on the Mount. He said, "Enter in at the strait gate, for wide is the gate and broad is the way that leads to destruction. Because strait is the gate and narrow is the way that leads to life." Therefore, may we choose the strait and narrow gate as we look down the road of life. Will our look down the road into the future be for our spiritual gain or our spiritual loss?

These four guidelines are for us to consider for 2023. May we use them as our spiritual compass. May we see how they work out the next time we face the question of whether is is right or wrong.

One final thought for all of us. God has given us His son to be our Savior. When we do wrong, we have a Savior. We can be forgiven. That is good news! And there is more God has given us. He has given us the Holy Spirit. It is the Spirit who encourages us to check out the guidelines of our spiritual compass. So happy traveling in 2023. Let us practice the four guidelines and grow in Christ.
