We have begun our Lenten journey on our way to the cross and culminating in the Easter celebration of Christ's resurrection. Over these forty plus days our thoughts turn to the suffering and sacrifice of our Lord, of his forty days in the desert after which he was tempted by the evil one, of his journey through the countryside teaching, healing, driving out demons and modeling for us the love, compassion, faith, and obedience to which we all should be striving.

A Word from Your Pastor

In reality, this should be our everyday goal, the focus of our daily prayers and walk with Jesus and should not be limited to just these forty days.

But there is something about Lent that fuels this renewed interest in trying to understand what Jesus went through, to symbolically walk in his footsteps the best that we can and to gain a greater appreciation for the gift we have been given through his life, death, and resurrection.

It is also a reminder that as much as this world (and by world, I mean us human beings locked in sin) creates this chaos, this upheaval, this unrest - God has a plan, a plan to recover, to reclaim and to restore His world. A plan that included a personal visit, an in breaking into this world, an intervention the likes of which the world had never experienced before. With the arrival of Jesus in the flesh, God put this plan into motion taking a hands-on approach and proving beyond a shadow of doubt the incredible love God has for each and every one of us.

In becoming one of us, God through Jesus revealed just how valuable and precious we are, even in our sinful states and through Jesus provided us a way for our sins to not only be forgiven, but to be like they never happened. This is the power of God and God's love for us, the power to take that which is abhorrent, that which is evil, that which is life draining and turn it into that which is beautiful, righteous and life giving. Jesus through his life, death and resurrection not only took these sins upon himself, but actually became these sins so that we might be made pure and whole once again. And this was done out of a love that is beyond measure, that is incalculable, that is eternal, that is as consistent and as reliable today as it was when God called the world into being.

Maybe that is why Lent means so much to us, it is a reminder of this love, this love that endured temptation, that overcame ridicule and rejection, that even in the face of torture and death never blinked but rather took on the evils of this world all the way to and through the cross. Lent reminds us once again of this tragic journey, how the very Son on God suffered and died so that we might be redeemed, so that we might experience true salvation, so that our lives would not have an ending, but a brand-new beginning, in the here and now and in the ever after.

I pray we take time over these next forty days to reflect on our relationship with God, to examine our lives and choices we have made and to recommit ourselves to drawing ever closer to our Lord seeking only his will and purposes for our lives. And remember, that no matter where we find ourselves or what is going on in our lives, the love of God is more than strong enough to overcome any chaos, any upheaval, any unrest, and it is this love that will recover us, reclaim us, and restore us to the glory of our God. May we take what we learn here and apply it to the rest of our lives as we seek to be the people of God.
