Board Votes to Reduce Number of Meetings

At its meeting on Sunday, March 19, the Board voted to reduce the number of Board meetings held each year from six to four. It was felt that meeting once a quarter would be sufficient to conduct the church's business. If any time-sensitive business comes up in between the scheduled meetings, it can be handled either by the Executive Committee (which is made up of the seven elected officers) or by holding a called Board meetings. A similar decision was made regarding the Cabinet meetings. These will also occur once per quarter rather than every other month. These meetings are generally to coordinate schedules among the various departments. The new schedules for these meetings are the third Sundays of:

Board Cabinet
January March
April June
July September
October December

This schedule for the Board meetings will also allow us to hold our Congregational meeting in early/mid-November as called for in the By-Laws.

Board Approves Contract Extension for Edd Spencer

The original contract with our interim minister, Edd Spencer, expires at the end of April. It is clear that we will not have a new minister by then, so Edd has graciously consented to continue serving, but with a few modifications to our agreement. Edd and Mary Pat wish to be freer to travel and spend time with family as Edd moves toward full retirement, so he will be working in the office two weekdays (Monday and Thursday) rather than the three he works currently. In addition, they will be on vacation a couple of weeks in May and again in July. Edd will continue to be available as needed for hospital visits and other needs as well as participating in special events that fall on other days of the week or weekend (e.g. AAA, Brown Bag programs). The new contract runs through the end of August 2023, with the option to extend it one more time through Christmas 2023, if needed.
