#### A Word from Your Pastor

I celebrate the wonderful Search Committee we have at Valley and the wonderful job they are doing. Their ministry of searching for a new pastor reminds me of another Search Committee in the Bible. It was a Search Committee of one person named Samuel. He was searching for a new king for Israel. You can read about his search in I Samuel 15:34-16:13. Let me share the story with you.

Samuel is sent by God to find a new king. God says to Samuel, "Fill your horn with oil and go. Go to Jesse who lives down the road in Bethlehem, for I have provided for myself a king among his sons." "What?" thought Samuel. "No nationwide search? No church profiles to fill out? No resumes to read? The town and home, already picked out?" Samuel was the Search Committee who went off looking for the next king, and God had made it all easy by narrowing the search down to the little town called Bethlehem.

Samuel came to the house of Jesse and Jesse sent his sons in one by one for interviews with Samuel. Samuel interviewed them all and in every case something was not quite right. In every case Samuel would say, "No, that's not the one. Next... "

Samuel learned four things about his search process. First the search takes a lot longer than you think. Second, you look at a lot of candidates who on the surface look pretty good, but are not quite right somehow. They all have good qualifications but there is still something

Third, you should never give up because the right one will come along someday. And fourth, the most important one, God does the choosing. God chose David to be the next king.

We think we have God's plan for our lives all figured out, but it is God who does the choosing. We think we have the right person for this position or that, and we work hard at the choice, but it is God who does the choosing.

Notice that God often chooses ones we would least expect. Why? Because God does not look on appearance. God always looks on the heart. Look at David, the youngest son of Jesse. David was so young and just a nobody in the family. He was the one who was chosen to be king because God looks not on appearance; God looks on the heart.

Some people say I am too old or I am too young, God will never want me. That may be what David thought that day as Samuel came around looking for a new king to take Saul's place. The farthest thing from David's mind was that he would even be considered, much less chosen. But let me say it again, God does not look at age or outward appearance; he looks at the heart.

All of us at Valley Christian need to remember that God has called you and me in a special way to serve him. He will choose a new minister to come and serve Valley. Because that is the way that God works. Thanks be to God! Samuel may be the Search Committee, but it is God who does the choosing. God Bless You, Edd
