I celebrate that every Sunday we have an opportunity to partake of the holy communion together. In this sacrament we claim the scripture in John 6:35 when Jesus said, "I am the bread of life; he who comes to me shall not hunger, and he who believes in me shall never thirst." A few verses later, our Lord repeated the same theme. He said in John 6:51, "I am the living bread which came down from heaven, if any one eats of this bread he shall live forever".

Jesus is saying, "I am the bread of life". He did not say, "I am the cake of life". Cake is a luxury in life. Bread is an essential in life. Jesus was saying, "As bread is necessary to sustain the body, so I am essential to sustain the soul. I am the bread of life". Jesus is not a luxury in life. He is the essential of life. He is necessary for our spiritual growth. Jesus is not the cake of life.

He also is not the turkey of life. Turkey is something that many families have only twice a year. They have turkey for Thanksgiving and Christmas. Now some people think that Christ is like this. They feed on Him once or twice a year. They come to church on Christmas and Easter. But Christ says we need to feed upon Him, not twice a year or once a week, but daily. As bread is food which keeps the body going each day, so Jesus is the spiritual food that keeps the soul alive.

Jesus is not the cake of life. He is not the turkey of life. And finally He is not the medicine of life. Medicine is a food for the body. It often does not taste good. Unlike cake and turkey, we do not take medicine because we enjoy it. But medicine is necessary. It can save our lives. It can make health possible. Some people seem to believe that Christ is the "medicine of the world". They come to Him only when they are sick or in need. They come to Jesus when all else has failed. They seek His presence only when they are in difficulty.

So, may we remember that the bread that comes down from heaven is not cake, turkey or medicine. The bread that comes down from heaven to satisfy our spiritual hunger is the Son of God. He is the bread for the soul. He lived and worked, laughed and cried, suffered and died and rose again. He is our savior. May we allow Him to feed our souls. To Christ be the glory.
