On Sunday, September 24, 2023, the search committee presented its candidate to the official board at a special called meeting, and the board voted unanimously to recommend to the congregation that a call be extended to Pastor Rick Malugani to serve as our next Senior Minister.

Therefore, a congregational meeting is scheduled for Sunday, October 8, 2023 to vote on this call.

The congregation will have an opportunity to meet and talk with Rick and his wife Ellen when they travel from their home in Fairhope, Alabama to visit us on October 8th. Rick will preach that day and assist with other parts of the worship service. Following worship, we will gather in the fellowship hall for a catered lunch and a time to hear more from and speak personally with Rick and Ellen. Members of the congregation will then vote on his call.

The search committee feels that God has worked to bring Rick and Valley together at this time. Rick's faith views, passion for the Gospel of Jesus Christ, personality and interest in partnering with us align very well with characteristics we hoped for in a minister which surfaced during Valley's self-assessment in 2022:

- Is an effective preacher
- Is compassionate and caring
- Is emotionally mature and secure
- Has the ability to deal effectively with disagreements
- Possesses strong pastoral care skills
- Is a person of strong faith
- Works regularly to bring new people into the congregation
- Builds a sense of fellowship/teamwork with the congregation and staff

This is an exciting time and we hope many members and friends of Valley will be present on October 8th for this special occasion for worship together and to meet Rick and Ellen. It's especially important for members to attend and vote on this call as we look to the next chapter of possibilities in our ministry as a church.

We encourage you to bring any questions you may have for Rick. If you prefer to submit written questions to me ahead of time, I will give them to Rick to address.
